

Education students' pass rate on 2007 MTTC matched by only one other Michigan college

RC students taking the Michigan Test for Teacher Certification in 2007 earned a 100% pass rate—a rate only matched by one other college in the state.

Anyone who wishes to have certification to teach in Michigan must take and pass the MTTC. The 100% pass rate means that all Rochester College students who took the test in 2007 passed and were therefore recommended for certification, compared to the state average of 90.3% (some colleges even averaged as low as 61.1%).

"We are proud of our students and have worked hard to provide a curriculum that prepares them for the demands of serving as teachers," said Jeff Simmons, Dean of the College of Business and Professional Studies. "The success they have had is indicative of the quality of students and the level of hard work and determination they put into their studies."

The MTTC program includes subject-area tests, world language tests, and a basic skills test, which includes questions in reading and mathematics and a written performance assignment in the writing section.1


